JUNE LETTER FROM THE CHAIR

Dear BLOCNotes Reader!

And now for something completely different! From the dystopian terrifying *Urinetown* we move swiftly to 'where the wind comes sweeping down the plain.....': the Oklahoma territory in 1906, about to become a brand new state. Now a 75 year old classic, our autumn production will take us to an entirely different place with a brand new cast and crew. (Sorry everybody that there was no break between *Urinetown* Get Out and *Oklahoma!* Intro evening but to get it all sorted before everybody disappears for the long summer break....well, we had no other option.)

congratulations Again, to all the Urinetowners. When I first saw the show in Edinburgh I was blown away by its vibrancy and energy which Emanuelle's production captured along with a good helping of irony and humour which I hadn't noticed so strongly before. It had its fair share and more of 'oh wow's' from those lucky enough to get a ticket. If we were anxious at the outset about audience numbers we didn't need to be - with a good trailer, excellent use of social media and word of mouth we managed, inspite of muggy weather, exam time, and other productions topping and tailing ours, to fill nearly all the seats. De Warandepoort had its pluses and minuses audiences loved the place (unless they were queuing interminably for a drink at the bar) cast & crew backstage not so much.

Urinetown was not easy music to sing nor were the dance routines a doddle and it would be ridiculous to pick out any one actor because it's an ensemble piece and really, I couldn't see a weak link – I could feel how alert, and well drilled the cast was – loving

every moment – enjoying what they were doing as they fed the audiences with the Urinetown magic. BLOC has quite a history of shows with wow factor that stick in your mind and *Urinetown* can be up there with the best of them.



So, while Urinetown was rehearsing, the November show had to be planned and prepared for. Oklahoma! Stage Director Marie Rousseaux has done a huge amount of work behind the scenes, choosing audition pieces, already rounding up her teams, designing her set and sorting out her rehearsal schedules. There are some classic songs to learn - we'll be taught them by Music Director Steven De Mesmaeker and Jean Emmett has agreed to choreographer to teach us all hoe-downs, line dancing or whatever it is they did in early 20th century Oklahoma. Should be a whole lot of fun. Marie and Steven welcomed about 120 auditionees to De Kam and by the time this Blocnotes is published we should have a cast list. First rehearsal after the summer break will be 10th September for the soloists and on the 11th for chorus and soloists.

The show selection group is working on updating our list of yes-no-maybe shows for the future. The Committee aims to consider offers for May and November 2019 when we return from summer break, in order to take a decision by end September.

The Crazy For You DVD showing in the Kleine zaal of DE BOSUIL on Tuesday 26th June at 20h and rounds the season off for BLOC. So, until we meet again, best wishes for a peaceful, trouble-free, safe-journeyed summer. Perhaps see you in the courtyard of De Kam Sunday 9th September 2018 for the BLOC Annual BBQ?

MAKE YOUR PITCH FOR A BLOC SHOW -

DO YOU HAVE AN IDEA FOR A SHOW?

The dates of performance are

- end May 2019 at De Lijsterbes (196 seats) in Kraainem:
- end November 2019 at the Auderghem Cultural Centre (@660 seats).

BLOC is looking for shows which accommodate a range of ages and nationalities, with good chorus opportunities. The November show invariably has a large cast and should be suitable for family pre-Christmas entertainment, with auditions held in June. The May show can be more edgy, innovative or just more suitable for a smaller audience, with auditions in January.

Before making a pitch, you must have a team in place (experienced stage director, stage manager, producer, musical director and rehearsal pianist), and know that the rights (if any) are available. Teams on stage and off are volunteers (BLOC only pays its musical directors and choreographers).

There is currently an ad hoc Show Selection Sub Committee chaired by Jeanette Marino, who is updating our Future Shows List but to make things simple, anybody interested should email.

Those interested should be ready to make their pitch to the committee mid-September 2018.

OKLAHOMA! 2018

Oklahoma! Director's thoughts.

After a very impressive number of people who came to the Oklahoma! Presentation evening and to the chorus auditions, the hardest task was to find THE Curly, THE Laurey, THE Jud, etc., who best fitted my vision.

Due to the interest shown for main parts we made the acting/reading as the first part of the soloist auditions. I really understand that this surprised quite a few people, and some felt frustrated as they didn't get the opportunity to sing. However, in my view, a musical is a play with musical numbers that continues the text; "they emphasize it, they embellish it and they illustrate it", especially through the dance. In Oklahoma! the text – as I have said many times - is even more important as it is written in "dialect of its specific time and place - Indian Territory, circa 1907". So, because of this, the interpretation of the dialogue was key before any of the singing – but, believe me, the quality of singing was never in question.

Then came the call-backs..... the bar was already raised very high at the soloist auditions and a selection had yet again to be made. Some very tight.

The candidates we didn't call back were either not what we were looking for or else there was no doubt they were. For those who were called back I, as Stage Director, was hoping they would give the "je ne sais quoi" that would make me think "yes, that's the one!".

For some of the roles, acting is primary and sometimes just a little thing makes the difference from even a perfect audition and a not-so-perfect one; a gesture, a facial expression, etc. And that's what happened during the call-backs. Furthermore, I like to give the candidates total freedom of their interpretation of the character. Then I compare whatever candidates come up with (and they all were very imaginative) with what I had in mind, which wasn't entirely set in stone beforehand, I must say, and see which one 'tickled' me the most.

I know how disappointing and frustrating it can be when you don't get the part you were hoping for and I also know that a lot of you take auditions very seriously, which provided us with performances of very high quality. We are well aware that it also takes time and dedication to learn new songs and texts by heart, especially at such short notice after the last production, and we are very thankful for all the energy you have invested, the passion and imagination you have shown at the auditions.

I wish I could have given everybody who auditioned a part in the chorus, or a cameo role or the solo role they were wishing for. At auditions a Stage Director has to make difficult decisions, difficult choices and can't please everybody – it's a risk and comes with the territory. With the vast numbers of auditionees at BLOC auditions these days, it's inevitable that not everybody will be happy with the results. For now, the main principals have been cast... agreed and announced (See below). Here is the list for chorus members who made it through; not all have confirmed yet their full participation. Cameo roles will be published after the summer break.

Oh, what an exciting experience so far!

But now it's time to build the brand new state of Oklahoma! where the waving wheat can sure smell sweet ...

We are looking for 50-60 adults and teens, and about 50 children. There are lots of named parts and cameos for absolutely *all* ages, including one big scene for singer-dancers.


Auditions will be held *between* October 6th and 14th, in the usual Green Parrot, friendly work-shop style, with call-backs over the following week and a half or so.
